

Lippert Electric Tongue Jack Install

Why I did it, I'm 71 and usually camp alone, so when the wife asked me to get something I wanted for Christmas, I chose this.

History: If you followed the posts, the first jack I got from Etrailer.com was wrong. They sent me a prepaid return label and sent me a new one. The first one had more than one wire for some other control system and would not work manually.

My Electrical Connection.

My Used Camper came with no battery so I installed an group 27 AGM battery (\$100 at a Flea Market) and Quick disconnect AMP plug. The wires go to a 1/4-20 Stainless Bolt and washers for connection to the trailer and Jack. Pink to battery connector, Red to jack. Other wire goes to trailer. This will be taped well with electrical tape. Terminals are crimped then soldered. I used this method for my boat and they lasted over 20 years with zero problems.



This is the AMP connector for the battery:



Tools needed:

½ “(new) and 9/16” (old) sockets or wrenches.

Wire strippers and terminal crimpers.

Soldering iron or gun. solder.

Yellow (#10) terminals for jack wire and others as needed.

Jack Stands.

Wood blocks.
